Dear Friends

Greetings in the name of Jesus! Many of us associate February with love. This makes sense since it the month when Valentine's Day occurs. We will be seeing images of hearts and red. We will be reminded to purchase our cards, gifts, and candies for our sweethearts. Many of us will be going out for romantic dinner, while others will have a special meal at home. February is a month where love is in the air!

When we hear the word love, we most often associate it with feelings of romance even though we know that there are other types of love. There is a special bond that we feel for members of our family and close friends. We also love God, our country, our favorite sports teams, and special kinds of food. In these examples, the word "love" is the same, but we know it means something different depending on what we are talking about.

There are times when love evoke positive emotions but there are moments when loving even a family member is difficult. We might express it by saying, "I love you, but I don't like you right now." Even though we may not appreciate their behavior, we are still committed to them as a spouse, a sibling, or a friend no matter how hard it may be. Others are more difficult for us to love either because of what they have done, who they are or how they have treated us. This could be a close relative or just an acquaintance.

The issue of loving difficult people is not a new one. In fact, Jesus had a few things to say about loving others. They are as relevant in our day of social media and political divide as they were to people living under the reign of a foreign government centuries ago.

As we continue through a series of sermons based on things Jesus said, we will examine what Jesus taught about loving our enemies on February sixth. In some ways it is one of the more challenging things that Jesus preached. Most of us can justify our dislike even our hatred for those who have hurt us. The call to love our enemies whether political or personal seems like a monumental task. Jesus reminds us that it is rooted in the very character of God.

Jesus' teaching to love our enemies expands our understanding of who God is and how we are to treat each other. On February thirteenth we consider another area where we are challenged to think beyond our comfort zone. We remember that scripture teach us to love God and to love our neighbor. In a world where there is so much need, who is my neighbor? Where does my obligation to love the other end? Jesus addressed those questions by telling a familiar story. I hope that you will join us as we consider what Jesus said.

As we think about some of the things Jesus said over the next couple of months, I pray that we will grow in our relationship with God. I want us to have a deeper understanding of the things Jesus taught and I desire for us to apply them to our lives. I am looking forward to worshiping with you in person or online.

Once a month Winter Get-togethers: February 16<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in the Wesley Room.


NEW series of weekly meetings begins March 2nd through May 25<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday evenings from 7:00pm till 8:30pm.

### Mission Team News....

2021 was a very busy year for the mission team! Here is a summary of what kept us on our toes during those twelve months:

- > The team created two documents to guide our service: a statement of purpose and guidelines for the distribution of funds.
- > A history of our relationship with the church in Carrillos, Costa Rica was written.
- > A van load of supplies was collected and distributed to people living under a bridge in Pittsburgh.
- > 150 meals were prepared and delivered for take-out at the Roots of Faith ministry in Sharpsburg every month.
- > Roughly 125 150 meals were prepared and distributed each month at the Drive Thru Dinner.
- ➤ Pastor Keith and Pastor Matt saw the Prayer Station at the DTD grow from just a few folks stopping to pray, to nearly everyone stopping to pray. We have gotten to know the folks who regularly visit the DTD and have begun building relationships with them.
- > The team was able to do some much needed repair work at the home of one of the DTD regular clients.
- > In October the team began to deliver meals to some members of our own congregation as a way to let them know that we care about them.
- > The team put together Advent candle holders and an Advent devotional for distribution at the DTD as well as putting together a nativity craft and some small treats for the children.
- > "Blessing Bags" were distributed to every DTD family in December. These bags were given by the Women's Bible Study members and truly were a blessing!
- The team prayerfully determined the year-end distribution of funds to the following ministries: Camp Allegheny, Jumonville, and Wesley Woods, Casa Cielo Orphanage (Honduras), Shram Ashram Ministry (India), Roots of Faith, Missionary, John Chitester (Harvest Alliance), Heifer International, Iglesia Metodista Palabra Viva! (Costa Rica) and its pastor, The Lighthouse Foundation, North Hills Community Outreach, Northside Common Ministries, UMCOR, Wings Prison Ministry, Wycliffe Bible Translators, Samaritan's Purse, and the Light of Life Mission.
- > The mission team grew from a handful of people to more than 25 regular volunteers who range in age from a middle schooler to senior citizens, and include a DTD client.
- > The team enjoyed the active, prayerful, and financial support of the congregation. We held no fundraisers, yet we were never short of funds or volunteers. Thank you!

All in all, 2021 was a year of blessing in spite of the global pandemic! God is so good! In January of 2021, probably none of us could have imagined what the year would bring. None of us knows what God has in store for us in 2022. There is one sure thing, though. The Bakerstown Mission Team is excited to discover how God is calling our congregation to serve next!
