Dear Friends.

Greetings in the name of Jesus! As we approach the holiday season, I can't wait to listen to Christmas music, which I absolutely love. I do try to hold off until after Thanksgiving but some of it sneaks its way into my ears that holiday is completed. It doesn't matter if it is secular in nature like Mel Torme's "The Christmas Song" or singing "Silent Night" by candlelight, the music puts me in the Christmas spirit. I even don't mind hearing Wham's "Last Christmas!"

In addition to enjoying the music, I am fascinated by the stories behind the song. For instance, "White Christmas" was written in 1942 by Irving Berlin for the film "Holiday Inn" and won the Academy Award for Best Original Song at the 15th Academy Awards. There is some debate whether the song about an old-fashioned Christmas setting in winter was written in California or Arizona. Either way, the composer was probably working on a warm sunny day. It is also interesting to note that one of our nation's most beloved Christmas songs was written by a Russian Jewish immigrant.

There are meaningful stories behind the Advent hymns and Christmas carols we sing in worship as well. Whether they are quoting scripture or infused with poetic imagination, they help us express our faith and grow in our devotion to the God. Sometimes they are the result of the author's wrestling with the events of their day, which can help us in the circumstances we are facing. Pastor Amanda and I will explore the lessons of some Advent hymns and Christmas carols during our Advent sermon series entitled "The Music of Christmas."

The message of Christ's birth as contained in the music of Christmas is really about God's love coming to earth. God chose to become flesh to break through the darkness of sin and death. The entirety of Jesus' life, ministry, death and resurrection is about God entering the world in unexpected ways. As Christians, we ask God to enter our lives and our world in miraculous ways.

Earlier this year we were praying together a "Break Through Prayer." That prayer made a difference in my life and in the life of others in our congregation. You may have noticed that we have been including a new "Break Through Prayer" in our bulletin. It is the prayer that many churches in our Annual Conference have been using. I hope that you will join me in praying it as we enter the New Year.

Break Through Prayer

God of healing and hope, Break through the messiness of our lives with the power of your Holy Spirit. Re-connect us with you, so that we can hear your voice more clearly and allow your love to be reborn in our hearts. Break through with your resurrection power to re-connect us with one another and lead us to new partnerships in our communities. Reveal to us your new and next steps for reaching, welcoming, and developing your people. Empower us to share the good news of your transforming love and new life. Amen

I am looking forward to seeing how God answers this prayer in your life and in the life of our congregation. As we celebrate God coming into our world in Jesus, I pray that the songs we sing and the lessons we learn will draw us closer to the Lord. I know that God has great things in store for us this Christmas season and into the coming year. May you have a Merry Christmas and blessed new year!

You may or may not know the story of your birth. If you do, there is something special about hearing your origin story again and remembering how it all began for you. That's why we observe Advent: to celebrate how it all began for us. In The Christmas Letters, Magrey deVega invites you to hear about the miracle of Christ's birth from those who first told the story. The letters in the New Testament, known as the Epistles, contain the first attempts by the church to understand and celebrate the mystery of the Incarnation. They point us to the origins of what we believe about Jesus, fully human and fully divine. By spending time with these holy, ancient words this Advent, you'll come to know the meaning of Christ's coming like never before.

Read the New Testament letters, Romans, 1 John, Philippians, and Colossians as your first Christmas letters of the season and find within them an invitation from God to deepen your understanding of the Incarnation and embrace a fuller commitment to Jesus Christ

Over the past year we have seen the numbers of folks in our area, who experience food insecurity, grow to record numbers. Our November drive thru dinner was the largest by far since we began serving monthly meals five years ago. Our annual Friendsgiving was attended by a record number of folks as well. While we can tally the number of meals served this year, and dollars spent supporting mission projects around the world, what we cannot tally is the impact that our efforts have made on countless people. That tally awaits us in heaven. Thank you for supporting the mission team and its work in 2025. Get ready, because here comes 2026!





Pancakes at Work—The Men's Group hosted 8 Pancake Breakfasts in 2025.

Here are some fun facts about the breakfasts and how the men made use of the funds the breakfasts generated:

266 total volunteers at the breakfast (59 different people that worked at least one of the breakfasts)

2650 customers served (many received second, third or even fourth servings!)

\$11,968.82 profit

\$1282.00 donated back to BUMC for supplies and utilities (10% of the proceeds we clear at each breakfast)

\$1282.00 donated to the different charities we supported with breakfast proceeds (we choose a charity every month to support with 10% of our proceeds)

\$3078.00 our customers donated to those charities

\$2500.00 for the handicap accessible curb cutout at the Fellowship Hall entrance

\$3870.00 to 9 different youth that attended the conference Christian camps over the summer

\$1500.00 to the conference camps (\$500 each to Camp Allegheny, Jumonville and Wesley Woods)

\$1000.00 towards the cost to replace the 9 year old computer in the sound booth

\$593.10 towards supplies and shipping for the Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes

\$200.00 to a Boy Scout from our congregation to help fund his Eagle Scout project

\$250.00 to the Network For Life organization

2025 Trustees Report

The Trustee's Committee had a busy year caring for the physical assets of Bakerstown United Methodist Church. While we believe our facility and properties are in good condition, there are many work items that must be addressed to keep our facilities in serviceable condition.

The Trustees wanted to share an overview of the various work items we completed in 2025. As we look back, much work was completed to maintain, service, and upgrade the physical plants of our church.

Early in the year, efforts were focused on upgrading the flooring in the Stitch and a Prayer Room. Another major project included the retrofit of new light fixtures into the choir and chancel soffit. This was a major project which was successfully completed. Thank you to Bill Shepherd for his relentless work in seeing this project through to completion. I am sure that the choir is also grateful for his efforts.

While many work items were completed at both parsonages, the Lee Road chimney required attention last winter. This chimney was inspected and cleaned to ensure safe operation for venting.

Another lighting project completed this year was the replacement of the balcony soffit and stairwell lights. Again, Bill Shepherd administered this project and worked hard to see its successful completion. The dimming controls were also upgraded as part of this work.

The United Methodist Men requested that Trustees investigate the possibility of installing a handicap accessible entrance at New Fellowship Hall. Through the generosity of the UMM, they made partial funding available which allowed us to complete this project in late March. The new entrance has proved to be both an improvement and a benefit for all those using this entrance for various events.

As the weather improved, the Trustees worked to have the open mortar joints in the brick piers at the North Entrance ground and repointed. This was a necessary item to extend the life cycle of the masonry in this area. Trustees also entered into an important HVAC contract to service the various pieces of equipment and systems that are located throughout our facilities and parsonages.

After one of the harsh spring storms, flashing was dislodged on the high sanctuary roof. Trustees worked to secure a contractor to make the repairs before any damage occurred in the Sanctuary ceiling area.

As the year progressed, the Trustees completed their duty of performing the annual parsonage inspections. While other work was planned, these inspections identified items that also needed to be addressed for both maintenance and safety reasons. The Trustees are working on a comprehensive list of items to improve the living quarters for the Dunns at the Hytyre Farms parsonage and Pastor Amanda and her family at the Lee Road parsonage.

As summer arrived, the Trustees focus shifted to the grounds of our church. Tree removal and tree trimming was performed for safety considerations near the children's playground. Other work included site cleanup, mulching, and weeding. This work was ongoing into the Fall with hopes of completing this site maintenance before the snows of winter arrive. Thank you to Peggy Hill for her work on this project.

This past year, Trustees were approached by two Eagle Scout candidates for small improvement projects on the building site. These projects are in the planning stages and may become a reality as the necessary plans are finalized, funds are raised, and the work completed. More information will be forthcoming on these projects as details are finalized.

In September, Trustees were faced with two problematic exterior hose bibbs. Both the hose bibb by the kitchen, and the one near the North Entrance were replaced. A big thank you goes to Bob Grier for his efforts in investigating and coordinating the work to replace these problem devices.

More recently, new lights were purchased and installed to better illuminate our signage along Route 8. Again, another thanks goes out to Bill Shepherd for his work on these lights. Our landscaping contractor also reworked some of the island areas to eliminate the ground cover and installed river gravel to eliminate longer term maintenance.

Thanks also go out to the many volunteers and groups that help out and do work to preserve and upgrade our facilities. Trustees are grateful for these efforts, and we hope this work continues.

As the end of 2025 approaches, the Trustees will continue with the parsonage projects and the site/landscaping projects.

Thanks again to all involved as we continue to make BUMC a warming and proud place to worship.
