Dear Friends

Greetings in the name of Jesus! Last year during Lent many of us participated in a 28-day Dynamite Prayer experiment. We invited God's resurrection power into our lives and the life of our church. We asked God to break through our regular routines, our regular kind of thoughts, words, deeds and actions. We focused on what God was trying to say to us in new ways. Many of us experienced breakthroughs in our lives and the lives of our family members because of this experiment.

This year I am asking us to participate in a 28-day experiment during the month of February using the Dynamite Prayer book by Rosario Picardo and Sue Nilson Kibbey. I have heard that many people gain further insights into the life of prayer and experiencing God's resurrection power in their lives when they use the book a second time. That is why I plan to do it again and hope you will join me. If you were unable to participate last year and would like to do so this time, we will have details on how to purchase the book, possibly at a discount as soon as we get them.

I am looking forward to this second time with the Dynamite Prayer book and experiment for several reasons. There are 28 days in February which makes it a natural fit for a short month. Lent begins on February 18, which means we will have a good start leading up to this time of meaningful spiritual growth. I also hope to have more intentional conversation around the prayer experiment this time around leading to strengthening our connection in Christ.

You may have noticed the breakthrough prayer written by our bishop in our weekly bulletin. I hope you will continue using that along with using the book this February. All of this will lead to participation in "Dream Tables," a spiritually guided, discernment process for congregations to discover where God is leading them next in ministry.

I believe that it is time for us to begin discerning where we are heading in ministry together as a church. The "Dream Tables" approach will help us see where God is leading us now and provide tools for us to do so in the future. We will begin with a small team participating in four online 90-minute sessions led by Sue Nilson Kibbey and a one-to-one coaching session for our church. I am still learning more about this process, which will begin in early Spring.

I always look forward to Lent with great anticipation of what God will do in our lives. I hope that you will join me by participating in the 28-day Dynamite Prayer experiment, praying the breakthrough prayer and worshipping with us on Ash Wednesday, February 18<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 PM.

# February Happenings....

**DIGGing Deeper** is currently studying the book "The Bible With and Without Jesus" by Amy-Jill Levine, a Jewish professor of New Testament at Vanderbilt, and Marc Zvi Brettler, a Jewish professor of Judaic Studies at Duke University, discusses 6 stories in the Bible where Jews and Christians read those stories differently. It begins with the second verse of chapter 1 of Genesis. What was it that blew across the waters? In the Hebrew Bible the word ru'ach can be translated as wind, breath or spirit. Jews interpret this as wind and do not see this as a reference to the Holy Spirit but for Christians this is the first time the "Spirit of God" or Holy Spirit is mentioned in the Bible. The last session studies the passage "My God. My God. Why have You forsaken me?" We will study this passage the last Sunday before Lent and it makes a fitting introduction to our Lenten study which is described in another portion of this newsletter.

## **Lent with DIGGing Deeper | Sunday | 9:45am | Wesley Room | Feb. 22**

Do you remember those 3 hour Good Friday services where the pastors in the local ministerial association would speak on the seven last words of Jesus from the cross? That memory is what prompted our choice for a Lenten study, the book "Seven Words: Listening to Christ from the Cross" by Rev. Susan Robb. Each Sunday during Lent we will be looking at one or more of the words. It's from the cross that Jesus speaks and shows his deepest love for us. It's from the cross that Jesus' full humanity draws us closest to him. It's from the cross, as Jesus breathes his last breath and speaks his last words, that his deep trust in the Father and his divine glory are revealed. Those who listen to Jesus' last words from the cross will discover what he most wants them (the world) to hear and will experience an intimate and divine awe only available to those who are willing to draw near his cross.

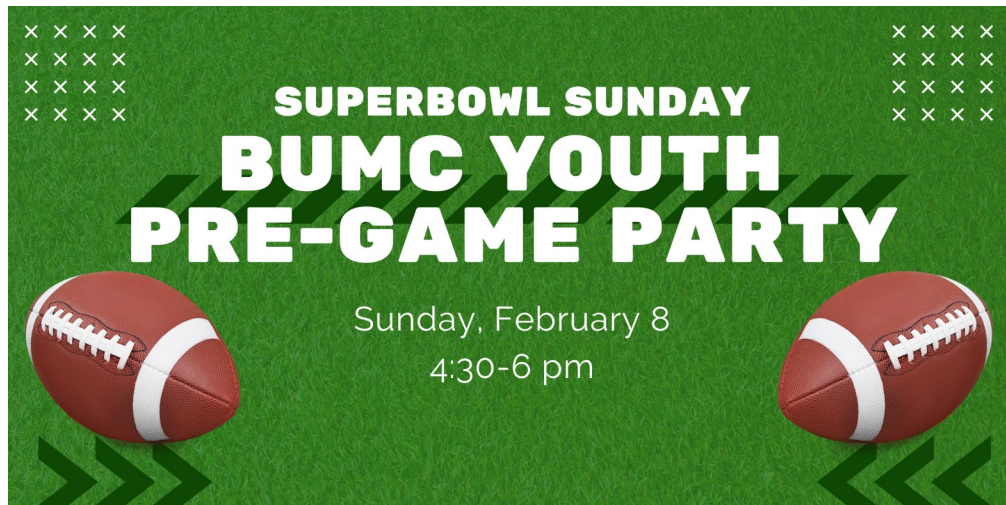

Draw us closer to Your heart, that we might know You better and understand You more completely. We pray that we would not only give things up for Lent, but that we would give You glory through Lent, Lord. May our actions reflect our hearts, and may we worship You through all that we say and do throughout the weeks to come. Jesus, the journey You took to the cross was full of betrayal, grief, torture, and darkness, yet Your love for us, Your people, propelled You onward. Help us to comprehend just how powerful that love is, that You would suffer such a cruel death to make a way for us to be with You in glory forever. What a gift, Jesus. What a gift. May our prayers and our praise never cease in this season. May our worship be unending. May our love for You find new depths. May this season bring new hope and new healing. May we journey toward the cross prayerfully and purposefully, even through our pain, our doubt, our questions, and our searching. May we find resurrection life springing up from this old dusty ground, and may we be surprised by joy in all of it. May Easter be a day of complete celebration as we rejoice in our risen Savior and praise our gracious Father. Thank You! Amen!

## Mission Team News....

As we begin our sixth year of Drive Thru Dinner, the mission team would like to thank the congregation for their support. Your financial support, as well as your prayers, time and talents have enabled the mission team to prepare well over 4,000 meals in 2025, help fund two volunteers in mission, send a team of workers to Costa Rica, financially support two missionaries and a crisis pregnancy center, assemble 8 cleaning buckets for the Mission Barn, and donate countless pounds of shelf-stable food to The Lighthouse. These numbers in and of themselves are not as important as the lives that have been touched by your generosity. Thank you for giving us the opportunity to serve Christ by loving our neighbors near and far.

Looking forward, we foresee that demand resulting from food insecurity in our area will continue to be high. Since we no longer are able to receive donations from Kohl's Cares, we are solely dependent on the congregation for funding throughout most of the year. The only fund raiser currently planned is the annual ***Junque Sale, scheduled for Saturday, April 25.*** It's not too early to start your spring cleaning and setting aside clean sellable items for the Junque Sale!

Also on tap for the summer of 2026 is a ***Sleep in Your Own Bed Mission Trip.*** The team is busy putting together a variety of local hands-on mission opportunities for this summer. Hello Church Family.

Thank you for supporting your church. In these uncertain times with rising costs everywhere you gave to your church in December showing an increase in giving. Unfortunately our expenses still exceeded our income at the end of 2025. Thankfully we had a reserve fund we could withdraw from in October in the amount of \$15,000.00. The trustees have been fully funded for the year 2025. They have so many projects around the church that need funded.
